### **3. International Friendship Day – Wednesday, 4 April 2018**

We will also be conducting recycling drives throughout the whole term, for food wastes, tetra packs, as well as paper and plastic recyclables. We seek to inculcate environmental awareness in your child, as part of developing responsible citizens.

Students are encouraged to donate to the school old newspapers, which will be collected by a recycling company. Your contributions will go towards helping the needy students in the school, as well as protecting the environment. We look forward to our joint effort in keeping our Earth green.

## 5. Phase 1 Registration of Children for Admission to Primary One in 2019

A child who has a sibling currently studying in the school is eligible to register under Phase 1 in the school. The child to be registered must be a **Singapore Citizen / Singapore Permanent Resident** and must be born between **2 January 2012 and 1 January 2013 (both dates inclusive)**. All parents/ guardians are required to complete the attached Sibling Survey Form (Annex A-2) and return it to the Form Teacher through your child by **Friday, 20 April 2018**.

## 6. School Annual Health Visit – Wednesday, 25 April 2018 to Monday, 30 April 2018

### For All Students

The Health Promotion Board's (HPB) Annual School-Based Health Screening will be conducted from **25 April to 30 April 2018** for all students. Please refer to the attached HPB letter printed in blue for more details.

### For Primary 1 and 5 Students

Please be informed that immunisation will be scheduled for **Primary 1 and 5 students only**. Parents and/or Guardians are required to submit their child's/ ward's latest medical information and provide consent for the immunisation online. To submit online, you may log in to the online portal via <https://childconsent.hpb.gov.sg> using your SingPass. Alternatively, you may obtain a hard copy consent form from the General Office. Please refer to the attached Immunisation Booklet for more information.

Please complete the above required procedure online and submit your child's/ ward's health booklets to your child's Form Teachers latest by **Friday, 20 April 2018**.
