# Celebrating a Decade of Dedication: Reflections on my MK Journey

My 10-year journey in MOE Kindergarten (MK) has been a remarkable one, which has made me more confident, committed, and mature in my work. I faced several challenges in the beginning when MK first started, and more effort was needed to convince families and the Early Childhood (EC) sector of MK's mission and intent. We worked hard to explain MK's purpose and shared good practices with the EC sector. I saw these challenges as opportunities to engage more EC practitioners and learn from one another.

As an MK Centre Head, I do my best to empower and inspire educators to work towards our shared purpose of supporting children's holistic development. I believe in providing quality learning experiences through appropriate pedagogies – these are crucial in supporting children's learning.

Over the years, I am heartened to receive updates from families of MK alumni. I am always excited to hear of the children's achievements, such as receiving awards or taking up leadership roles.



One of the memorable moments for me was supporting my first batch of K2 children in transitioning to primary school. Some parents were worried when they heard that their children would not be having a 'graduation ceremony' with mortarboards. My team explained that MKs would organise a 'K2 Celebrates!' event instead. This event would be more meaningful because it would celebrate the children's learning journey over the two K1 and K2 years, instead of a 'graduation ceremony' that would just spotlight the end of K2. On celebration day, families were proud and delighted to witness their children's confident presentations. Parents expressed deep gratitude and acknowledged that the event was meaningful and truly memorable for both them and their children.

In 2012, I embarked on a rewarding journey as a Mother Tongue teacher at MK. We offer classes in all three Mother Tongue languages (Chinese, Malay and Tamil) in MK. Our children learn in a rich language environment using Big Books, songs, rhymes and games set in the local context.

When I first joined MK, my centre was located at a community site. Today, all MKs are situated within primary schools - this allows a seamless transition for children from K2 to Primary One.

Over the years, the number of MK educators has grown in tandem with the increasing

number of MKs and there has always been a great emphasis on the professional development of educators. Personally, I have been given ample opportunities through many professional sharing platforms: MOE's Teachers' Conference and ExCEL Fest and ECDA's Early Childhood Care and Education Conference.

I am also honoured to be featured by the National Heritage Board and National Museum for my views on promoting the use of the Malay language among Malay families and developing an appreciation of the Malay culture.

As MKs look forward to the next 10 years, my goal is to continue nurturing an appreciation and love for the Malay language and culture among our children.

MKs also use teaching and learning resources with a distinctive Singapore flavour that the children can relate to easily.

Over the past decade, our team has been continuously refining the MK curriculum so that it is more child-centred and intentional in developing values, social and emotional skills and attitudes that can help the children adapt and thrive in the future. We encourage open communication and collaboration between teachers and families for a strong home-MK partnership.

Ten years on, I am heartened to know that the majority of parents have consistently reported their satisfaction with the quality of the MK curriculum, teachers and their child's overall experience in the MK. 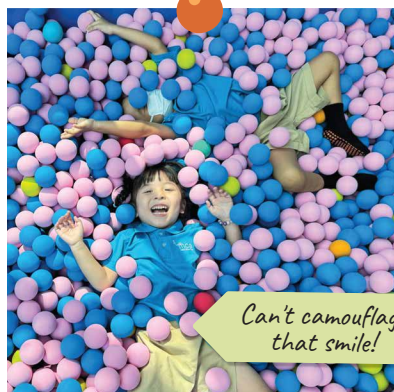

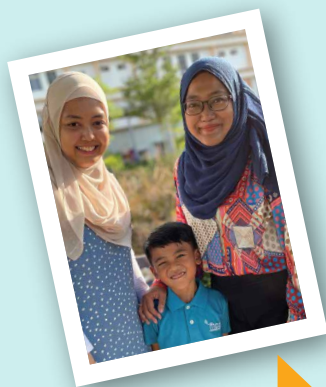

As a parent, it gives me great assurance to know that my son goes to school with a smile on his face each day.

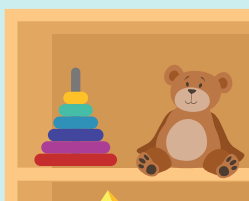
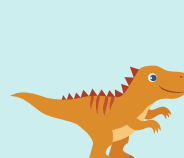

At a LIFE@MK session, we learnt valuable lessons from our son's teacher.

The first was that parents and teachers have the same goal - we want our children to grow up well. What children learn from teachers could be reinforced at home to strengthen their learning.

We can help our children practise their skills and let them try answering their own questions.

We can also let our children exercise some independence and develop good habits in daily living. We don't have to rush to help them put on their socks or shoes, or fold their clothes. We can let them try solving problems on their own first, before we

step in to help. Over-helping children is not beneficial for their growth. Many times, it is not that children can't handle 'problems' but they lack the opportunity and confidence to do so.

The session was a good time for me to stop rushing and hear about MK's educational philosophy and methods. It is also a time for me to think about how to educate my children. How should I bring him up? What adjustments do I need? It was also a time for me to meet Ms Geetha and Ms Audrey, whom my son often talks about.
